

English Language Learners

All school districts in Missouri are required to provide equal educational opportunities to students regardless of race, national origin, sex, color, or disabilities. To have access to school programs, English language learners (ELLs) (including immigrant children and youth, refugees, migrants, and undocumented students) must receive instruction that increases their English proficiency and core academic content knowledge.

To comply with Missouri School Improvement Program (MSIP) requirements, all school districts in Missouri must have in place an ELL policy or plan and an ELL assessment tool. A plan or policy in this context does not contain enough information to be called a program. An instructional ELL program addresses specific needs through a methodic course of action stated to allow ELLs to acquire expected ELP. ELLs are expected to acquire ELP in reading, writing, listening, speaking, and comprehension. This will enable them to meet the challenging state academic content and student academic achievement standards. An ongoing evaluation allows for program improvement.
