After careful consideration and discussions with our local and state partners, and with the March 24 issuance of a [Stay at Home order from Randolph County](#), the Moberly School District buildings will remain closed. At this time, we plan to reopen on Monday, April 27. We will continue to monitor the situation and adjust our plans as necessary.

Meal Service Continues

Meal service began March 23 and will continue every weekday during school closure. Three meals are provided at no charge for any child 18 and under. Meals can be collected at any of three locations, North Park, South Park, or Moberly High School from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

E-learning begins March 30

Although buildings are closed, on-line learning officially begins Monday, March 30. During this time students will be expected to follow the "Student To-Do List" below for online learning days. Teachers will be evaluating student work daily and be available through the online learning platform, Google Classroom, and through school email at various times throughout regularly scheduled school days. Please be patient for a response as teachers may be assisting other students/parents. Parents who have questions or concerns about e-learning or specific assignments are encouraged to email their child's teacher and/or the building principal. We will continue to follow the school calendar for learning days.

Student To-Do List (K-5 parents should help monitor this)

- organize learning based on the assigned lessons.
- check and complete online assignments and learning daily.
- email teachers if they are confused or have additional questions.
- reach out to teachers if they cannot complete assignments.

Please continue to follow the advice of our health officials. Practice proper handwashing and social distancing. Be mindful that our children look to us for guidance. Model calm and help reassure them that the adults in their lives are doing everything in their power to keep them safe. Despite the upheaval in our schedules and daily lives, we each have the ability to create new structure and routine for our children and ourselves by doing simple things like establishing a schedule and a routine location to work. Structure leads to predictability, and predictability is foundational to the trust that helps us all feel safe and be productive. Thank you for your support in our partnership to ensure that each of our students receive the support they need to continue learning and growing.
