2022-2023 School Year

As Moberly Public School District continues into the 2022-2023 school year post-pandemic, the District will return to pre-pandemic policies, procedures, and protocols, especially in regard to the health room. This information can be found in student handbooks and the District Board Policy.

Safe Return to School Plan Communication

As a requirement of the American Rescue Plan: Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ARP/ESSER III) fund, the following plan elements are necessary to include- Academic Programming, Operations, Family and Community Support, Communications, Health and Safety, and Technology. Any changes to the following will be communicated to parents and the community.

- Universal and correct wearing of masks
 - At this time our Randolph County community does not have a mask mandate. Masks are not required in the District; however, they can be worn if desired by an individual.
- Physical distancing (e.g. including use of cohorts/podding)
 - There is no cohorting or podding at this time beyond normal grade level and/or class groupings.
- Handwashing and respiratory etiquette
 - We continue to focus on proper hand hygiene and health etiquette as we typically do via policies and procedures. Hand hygiene sanitation stations are located throughout each building.
- Cleaning and maintaining facilities including
 - We continue to focus on proper maintenance and cleaning as we typically do via policies and procedures. Clean and disinfect building surfaces and high touch objects frequently.
- Adhere to isolation and quarantine guidelines from our local health agency. At this time RCHD are not enforcing isolation or quarantine.
 - We are not conducting contact tracing for COVID-19 isolation and/or quarantine.
- Diagnostic and screening testing
 - Covid-19 testing is not available within the District. We ask that staff and families continue to self-screen and monitor for illnesses per our illness guidelines. We encourage staff and families to obtain guidance from their Primary Care Physician or RCHD
- Collaborate with the local health department on vaccine recommendations. RCHD provides Flu and Covid vaccinations to our community by appointment.
- Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies

Continued Health Protocols

It is the District's desire to promote safety, health, and well-being of its students and staff and act quickly and efficiently to ensure the health and well-being of our students and staff.

Please note these **Continued Safety Activities:**

- As with any illness- All employees and students will be directed to stay home if ill.
- Practicing universal precautions, covering coughs & sneezes and good hygiene.
- Cleaning & disinfecting when increased illness occurs in a classroom or building.
- Periodic illness guideline reminder emails and updates to the district website will be available to staff and parents. If you present with symptoms of any illness, we encourage you to stay home when you are sick.

COVID-19: We continue to monitor reported positive cases of COVID-19 within our District and community. In the event of increased cases, we will provide that information to our families and continue with the health recommendations from the District and from our local health agency.

Student and/or Staff Illness:

A staff or student with illness symptoms who reports to the nurse's office at school will be assessed.

- If a staff or student presents with symptoms of illness that meet our illness guidelines, they will be asked to stay at home until symptoms improve and/or 24 hours fever free without the use of fever reducing medication.
